



US 191 Chinle - Black Mountain Wash

SHOULDER WIDENING

The Arizona Department of Transportation has initiated a shoulder widening project along US 191 in Navajo County. The project is located between Chinle and Many Farms from milepost 450 to 460.

PROJECT OVERVIEW

The shoulder widening project is scheduled to begin spring 2022 and end late spring/summer 2023. The project cost is approximately \$17 million. The purpose of the project is to improve safety by widening the shoulder on both sides of the roadway to reduce run-off road and rollover crashes.

The work includes, but is not limited to:

- ▶ Installing rumble strips on centerline and shoulders.
- ▶ Installing pavement markings.
- ▶ Installing traffic delineators, as required.

WHAT TO EXPECT

Construction will result in traffic restrictions for the traveling public. The roadway within the project boundary will be reduced to one lane of alternating north- and southbound travel through the construction zone. Flaggers and a pilot car will lead traffic through the work zone during construction.
